ARTEMIS II! NASA announced last week that four humans are set to visit the moon for the first time in more than 50 years. Piloting the 2024 Artemis II mission will be Victor Glover, a Christian who has worshipped with Churches of Christ in the Houston area and his home state of California. Here was his reaction, "I want to thank God for this amazing opportunity, and the celebration is about so much more than the four names that have been announced. I pray that God will bless this mission."

STOP, LOOK, AND LISTEN! These three words are commonly used in conjunction as a warning. Injury or death can follow when we do not heed these words. Many accidents could have been avoided at railroad crossings, and intersections had these words been heeded.

They can also serve us in our spiritual walk. The Bible is full of warnings to both Christians and unbelievers. In 2 Corinthians 13:5, we read, "Test yourselves to see if you are in the faith; examine yourselves! Or do you not recognize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you—unless indeed you fail the test?" In Matthew 3:7-8 we find, "But when he (John) saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, 'You brood of vipers, who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Therefore, bring forth fruit in keeping with repentance."

STOP and take stock of where we are. Are we "in Christ" where all spiritual blessings are found (Ephesians 1:3)? Have we been on the "go" so much that we have lost sight of what is most important (Philippians 3:12-14)? Demas did, according to 2 Timothy 4:10.

LOOK around and see that we are not in this alone. We are to be a blessing to fellow Christians, and they are to be a blessing to us (Galatians 6:1-2 & Romans 12:15).

LISTEN to others. Be "swift to hear" (James 1:19). It may be a neighbor's plea for help, as Jesus taught in the story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37). It may be one of our own who needs special care (1 Thessalonians 5:14). Or it might be someone under our roof whose cry we need to hear (Ephesians 6:4).

Whatever the case, if you and I STOP, LOOK, AND LISTEN. we will find ourselves ministering to those in need. Isn't that what Jesus did (Mark 10:43-45)? And don't we want to be like Him (Matthew 25:40)?
