Childrens Ministry

Hi Kids!

During the past 3 weeks in our Wednesday night Bible Discovery class, we have been reading the story of Queen Esther. It is one of my favorite Bible stories to tell because, through the entire book, things seem to be going so badly for the people of God on the one hand, while Haman (the bad guy of the whole story) seems to have everything go his way. It goes on like this right until the very end when, on the day that Haman woke up thinking he'd have the best day of his life, he instead ended up being executed after enduring a more humiliating day than he likely even thought possible! There's really not room to tell the whole story here, but I do want to talk quickly about one of the main points that stand out in Esther as well as several other places in the Bible. In Psalm 73, the author (a man named Asaph) starts out with a long list of complaints to God about how all the bad things seem to be aimed just at the good people while all the evil people seem to have all the good things come to them. He goes on like this for some time, and you begin to wonder how such a whiny prayer ended up in the Bible, but then in the middle, the whole thing turns around when Asaph says: "When I tried to understand all this, it troubled me deeply until I entered the sanctuary of God"... and in worship, everything becomes clear to him and to us. We see that even though his enemies are bragging now about how rich and important they are, they are all setting themselves up for ultimate disaster because they have made themselves enemies of God. The whole Psalm is brilliant because it's like a story about how he is changed from a complainer at first to having peace, knowing what's really important by the end, and the change took place because he brought his worship along with his complaints to God. The story of Esther (along with many others) has the same hinge point when she calls all the Hebrew people to worship and pray for three days to make the change possible. At first, she wanted to back out of the responsibility and kind of acts a little whiny about it, but after the three days, she boldly and courageously does what is necessary to save her people and bring Haman down!

If we are being honest with ourselves, we can also feel a little whiny dealing with our troubles, while others, who are not giving the glory to God, seem to enjoy effortless success. That is one very good reason we need to be in worship on a regular basis, to constantly keep our perspective of what's going to matter in the long run. Keeping perspective means that even though our troubles may not shrink right away, our worry about them does. I hope you never have the fate of an entire nation rest on your shoulders the way it did for Esther, but if God can handle that, He should be able to take care of anything else you're thinking about, right?


