Fifth, drop everything to help your friend in a time of crisis. After all, you never know when you'll be on the receiving end. Cultivate your friendships, and they will come back to bless you.

**TRUSTING GOD IN A WORLD IN CHAOS.** As the world somehow devolved further into chaos these past few days, we are once again faced with reconciling the presence of unbridled evil in a world created by a loving God. How do we make sense of these kinds of tragedies? It's impossible to "explain away" these events. Someone put it well this week when they said, "I don't trust God because I understand everything he does. I trust God because of who He is." Even if a person gets to the point where he thinks he understands, in theory, why evil exists, he can still get clobbered by the personal problem of evil. There are times to try and educate, but also times to simply listen and empathize. It's one thing to be a doctor of oncology, but it's quite another to be the patient fighting cancer. No amount of education on the problem of evil is going to budge the hearts and minds of those embroiled in this conflict, much less those observing it from a distance. Logic never did convince the heart. I so deeply empathize with the plight of those in the midst of this terrible conflict. As a husband and a father, the absolute horror of what so many are in the midst of right now takes your breath away. The only place I can find comfort is in the words of scripture that promise us there will come a day when this will no longer happen. I am challenged in my faith when I read these words of Paul: "For I consider that the sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us... For I am convinced that neither death nor life... neither height nor depth nor anything in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 8:18, 38, 39) That's a lofty expectation, and one we must cling to, at all costs. - Russell
