Happy Sunday!

For today's Psalm reading, I would like to look at Psalm 19:1-2.

The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours out speech,

and night to night reveals knowledge.

There are many people who believe that the Bible and faith in God all might have made sense back in the pre-scientific times when we didn't know any better, but now that we have things figured out, we don't need to rely on those old superstitions. This is a very common misconception, but the truth is actually much closer to what the Psalmist is saying here - Science and nature are not at odds with God. In fact, the closer we look into all the complexities of nature, the more it seems to scream out that only a supremely intelligent God could have put this all together!

There is a very fancy and complicated study in science called 'Anthropic Principle' which (as far as I'm able to understand it) states that the entire universe, not just Earth or even our solar system, seems to have been finely tuned to support the kind of systems that we need to survive. The list is growing all the time of all the ways everything has been so perfectly ordered to allow us to live. Just to name a few: our distance from the sun, the way our planet wobbles to give us changing seasons, the fact that water is one of the only materials (besides iron) we know of that expands instead of contracts as it freezes, the perfect balance of gases that make up our atmosphere and allow just enough sunlight in without radiating us to death almost any variation of any of those would make it absolutely unlivable on Earth. To me, the most interesting one was the size of the protons. I learned that protons are exactly 1.836 times larger than electrons. If it was different by any amount in either direction, oxygen – along with many other very important elements, could not exist. The scientists who stubbornly still want to deny a creator are now forced to adopt an even less probable scenario called multi-verse (very popular in movies these days), which, ironically, takes much more faith to believe than just admitting that we are the creation of a loving God.

The Israelites in the book of Exodus (which is the subject of our fast-approaching Bible Bowl competition) were repeatedly faced with just the same amazing evidence and, like so many today, refused to give God His due and follow Him in faith. I hope (at least in this instance) that we can all be more like King David. He knew what he was talking about - everywhere you look, everything you see is more evidence of a creator. Really, it takes too much work to stay blind to it.

Besides all the ways God has been keeping us alive on Earth, He has done even more incredible things to give us a way to thrive beyond this life as well... and that is what we learn about whenever we're together. I hope you can be here with us every time!

PRAY! Please pray for Bible Bowl Weekend: all the young people and adults who continue to study Exodus 1-20, all the parents and adults working with their teams, and Brian Driver as he continues to write the questions for the competition.

PUSH THROUGH IT! A pee-wee football team enthusiastically runs onto the field, where a prominently displayed break-through banner is held in place by pee-wee cheerleaders. Rather than breaking through the banner, the team begins running around it and is ungently directed to connect their mistake. Half the team changes course, heading back toward the banner. Likewise, those already past the banner immediately change their direction and head back toward the banner. Only in the opposite direction, meeting teammates at the banner in a hilarious display of mass confusion. Just then, the coach throws down his hat in frustration and walks away.

Endurance has been described as "pushing through it" - "it" being whatever stands in the way of spiritual progress. "It" could be a trial or tribulation (James 1:2-4; Romans 5:3-5). For Jesus, "it" was the cross. We are encouraged to "lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and...run with endurance the race that is set before us..." (Hebrews 12:1). We must "push through it." We must not "grow weary" or "lose heart in doing good" (Galatians 6:10). Instead, in light of the coming resurrection, we must "be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that (our) toil is not in vain in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 15:58). We find the strength to "push through it" by fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2).

We must not sidestep the inevitable suffering that comes our way but shoulder our burden with the help of God and our spiritual family (2 Timothy 3:12; Galatians 6:2, 5). Each "push through it" moment strengthens us for the next, building endurance and spiritual maturity (James 1:2-4). Such opportunities come and go. But, once they have passed, we cannot "push through it" in the opposite direction and expect to receive the promised blessing. However, we can reset our course and prepare for the next "push through it" opportunity to build endurance and demonstrate our trust in God.


