A lot of the supposed 'inconsistencies' in the Bible are really just people trying to squeeze out opinions that never existed. Sometimes, it's just silly examples to get a bulletin article started, but other times, it has been much more damaging. It has led to church division, family breakups, doomsday cults, and even deadly wars. It is not just history's greatest monsters acting this way, as I said, it is a temptation that anyone in the church can fall into. The way we avoid it is to keep an attitude of humility and always see ourselves as constant learners. If something doesn't seem right, it is always ok to dig in deeper and ask any question you have!

FATHER'S DAY! Today, we celebrate Father's Day. What a blessing a godly father is to his family. He becomes the impression of what God is like to his children and those images of good or evil, kind or difficult, moody or consistent, benevolent or stingy, selfless or hard to shape. We will never be perfect fathers, but we have the perfect standard, to strive to be like Him (Matthew 5:48). We have a special gift after worship in the fover for all the fathers that are present today!

YHWH! This summer, the theme of church camp is The Character of God. There was a moment when Moses had the nerve to ask God His name. God was gracious enough to answer, and the name he gave is recorded in the original Hebrew as YHWH. Over time, we've arbitrarily added an 'a' and an 'e' to get YaHWeH, presumably because we have a preference for vowels. Scholars and Rabi have noted that the letters YHWH represent breathing sounds or aspirated consonants. When pronounced without intervening vowels, it actually sounds like breathing: YH (inhale) and WH (exhale).

So a baby's first cry, their first breath, speaks the name of God. A deep sigh calls His name—or a groan or gasp too heavy for mere words. Even an atheist would speak His name, unaware that their very breath is giving constant acknowledgment to God. Likewise, a person leaves this earth with their last breath when God's name is no longer filling their lungs.

So when I can't utter anything else, is my cry calling out His name? Being alive means I speak His name constantly. So, can it be heard the loudest when I'm quiet? In sadness, we breathe heavy sighs. In joy, our lungs feel almost like they will burst.

In fear we hold our breath and must be told to breathe slowly to help us calm down. When we're about to do something hard, we take a deep breath to find our courage. When I think about it, breathing is giving Him praise. Even in the hardest moments! This is so beautiful and fills me with emotion every time I grasp the thought. God chose to give Himself a name that we can't help but speak every moment we're alive. All of us are always: walking, sleeping, breathing with the name of God on our lips!
