Acts of God

In the mid-1990s, Ed Nice and I started a business together. Those early years were both exciting and terrifying. We lacked experience, especially in legal matters, and had a lot to learn—starting with contracts. One of the very first things we included in our contracts was a *force majeure* clause. This legal principle refers to an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled—things like storms, power outages, and we always included "Acts of God".

To be honest, one of the main reasons we added that clause was because we genuinely wanted **God involved in our business**. It was our way of saying, "Lord, this is Yours. If You decide we shouldn't succeed, we'll trust You—and at least we won't be sued."

This past weekend, Doni and I visited the Marion Road Church of Christ and heard Russell preach a powerful message on suffering and the "Acts of God." It gave me a new lens through which to reflect on our experiences. Russell pointed out that **not all suffering comes from the same source**—but God can use all of it for His purposes.

1. God Uses Trials to Teach Us

2. James 1:2–4 reminds us that even hardship can be a gift:

"Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance..."

Through trials, God molds us—maturing our faith, deepening our trust, and drawing us closer to Him.

1. Sometimes the Enemy Is at Work

2. The French phrase *force majeure* literally means "superior force," and that force is not always divine. Sometimes, bad things come from **Satan**, who seeks to destroy.

"Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour." — 1 Peter 5:8

Even in those moments, God is still sovereign, still present, and still working.

1. Sometimes It's Simply a Fallen World

2. Romans 8 speaks of creation groaning under the weight of sin. When Adam and Eve sinned, decay, suffering, and frustration entered the world. Much of what we call "bad" isn't directly from God or Satan—it's simply the **natural result of a broken world**.

Our Response Matters

When life falls apart, we face a choice. We can **blame God**, or we can **seek Him**. We can become bitter, or we can trust that He's working—even in the mystery, even in the pain.

And in all of it, we have one unshakable promise:

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose." — Romans 8:28

Whether it's business challenges, personal trials, or spiritual warfare, God is never absent. He is the true "Superior Force," and in His hands, no suffering is wasted.
